- The Reserve Bank of India has issued the Scale Based Regulation (SBR): A Revised Regulatory Framework for NBFCs (the "framework")vide circular No. RBI/2021-22/112DOR.CRE.REC.No.60/03.10.001/2021-22 on October 22, 2021 read with Master Direction Reserve Bank of India (Non-Banking Financial Company Scale Based Regulation) Directions, 2023 circular no. RBI/DoR/2023-24/106 DoR.FIN.REC.No.45/03.10.119/2023-24. The Framework categorizes NBFCs in Base layer (NBFC-BL), Middle Layer (NBFC-ML), UpperLayer, (NBFC-UL) and Top Layer (NBFC-TL). The Company is classified under "Base Layer" pursuant to the framework.
- 7 The EPS has been computed in accordance with the Indian Accounting Standard.
- The figures for the quarter ended on March 31, 2025 and March 31, 2024 are the balancing figures between audited figures in respect of the full financial year and the published year to date figures up to the end of third quarter of the current and previous financial year which was subject to limited review by the Statutory Auditors.
- 9 Provision for income-tax has been made in accordance with the Ind AS-12.

- During the Financial Year the Board approved the Offer and issuance of fully paid-up equity shares of the Company for an amount not exceeding Rs. 29,00,00,000 (Rupees Twenty Nine Crore Only) (including premium) by way of rights issue to the existing eligible equity shareholders of the company as on the record date (to be determined and notified subsequently) in accordance with the applicable laws, including the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Issue of Capital and Disclosure Requirements), 2018, as amended, the Companies Act, 2013 and subject to such approvals, as may be required under the applicable laws (hereinafter referred to as "Rights Issue");
- 11 The Company's main business is dealing in shares, Futures and Options. All other activities of the Company revolve around its main business. As such, there are no separate reportable operating segments as per IND AS 108-Operating Segments.
- 12 The Company is involved in the business of investing in Shares, Futures and Options for its own account and as such has no customer base/interface at all; therefore there is no impact of following notifications issued by Reserve Bank of India (RBI):-
